### Scholarship

The Brothers of Lambda Iota were extremely pleased last semester with an average GPA of 3.18. That placed our chapter 2<sup>nd</sup> only Phi Sigma Kappa with 16 members, out of the 41 fraternities on campus. Our chapter has now been in the top ten in grades for 35 consecutive semesters. While the brothers, both undergraduate and graduate were enthused, the house is determined and motivated to come in first place this semester. In order to improve our efforts, the academic chair Jack Townsend implemented an academic advisor program this semester in which high achieving brothers met with the pledges within their major on a weekly basis. Our intelligent pledge class has given the house hope that a high standard of academic success will continue in our future. Scholarship is truly a top priority for the Brothers of Phi Gamma Delta.

# **New Pledge Class**

The Lambda Iota chapter pledged 35 new members this fall. With a new academic advisor program that is heavily focused on the pledges, we hope for them to be amongst the top in GPA's on campus. The pledge class has shown what it means to be a Fiji by demonstrating all the 5 points: excellence, knowledge, scholarship, morality, and friendship. The pledge class alone raised \$7,000 for Purdue University Dance Marathon. The entire class also participated in Winterization, which serves nearly 300 homes in the greater Lafayette area. They also spent time helping with the West Lafayette Parks Department clean up project at the Morton Community Center. We are proud of what the new pledge class has done and see lots of potential. We have very high expectations of these gentlemen to help take Phi Gamma Delta to higher levels.

#### Rush

Lambda Iota held rush at the beginning of the school year. In the fall of 2014, there were 325 young men whom rushed Fiji. We had to be very selective with who we pledged. We chose 35 rushees who we thought would be a positive influence to the chapter based off past academic standards, student involvement, and past achievements. #### Intramurals

The brothers have had a lot of success this past semester in Intramurals. It started off with a great semester with multiple teams in the B League and A League, with one Fiji team in each league making it to the championship game. Unfortunately, the B league came up short in the last minute of the game, while the Fiji Team in the A League prevailed in overtime. Both championship games brought a large crowd of brothers who supported the teams in their championship. The Fiji Soccer team consisting of sophomores through seniors made it to the quarterfinals. The indoor volleyball team made another championship appearance but came up short in close match to SAE. The most recent sport being played is the all campus basketball invitational, where the Fiji basketball team made another championship appearance but came up short.

#### **Graduate Relations**

Lambda Iota recognizes that Graduate relations are a key component in the infrastructure of Phi Gamma Delta. Class reunions held first semester at the chapter house celebrating 50, 25, 11 and 10 years impressed chapter members with the importance of our dedicated Graduate Brothers. This year, we are proud to announce that the graduate relations will be striving to exceed the expectations of even the most ambitious graduate relations program the Lambda Iota chapter has ever had. The foundation of this effort is reestablishing a close relationship with our graduate brothers. Some of the efforts to achieve this tremendous goal include but are not limited to: founding a mentors program between graduate brothers and undergraduate brothers sharing the same major, the reinstatement of the Russell Street Review and the Boilermaker Fiji, the continuation of the annual Pig Dinner which will be held on February 21st, and recording and submitting outstanding achievements both on and off campus in order to be in contention for many of the available Phi Gamma Delta cups. The objective of this new mentor program is not only to improve our connection with our graduate brothers, but also for the mutual benefit of the undergraduate and graduate brother. The graduate brother can provide guidance to the undergraduate brother based on his experiences in the field of the shared major. Not only does this help undergraduate brothers get internships and job opportunities, this also provides graduate brothers with great recruitment strategies and a chance to keep in touch with their lifelong fraternity.

# Philanthropy and Community Service

This semester the brothers of the Lambda Iota chapter have been busy participating in multiple philanthropy and community service events. We started off by having the Theta Fiji Grill-off, which benefited the Lafayette CASA, and raised over \$3,000. We also participated in Purdue's IFC Greek Week where we got first place overall out of 81 fraternities/sororities. Our chapter raised over \$1,000 for Greek Week.

We then participated in Multiple Purdue University Dance Marathon Events (PUDM), which benefit The Kids at Riley Children's Hospital. The events we participated in for PUDM were Greek Olympics, PUDM 5K, PUDM Golf Outing, and PUDM Dance Marathon. We also had multiple brothers participate in the First Annual PUDM 5K, which was created by our very own brother Christian Gatmaitan. For the main part of PUDM, The Dance Marathon that is 18 hours long, we had around 30 brothers that raised over \$16,000, which contributed to the \$1,002,510 to Riley Children's Hospital. This is the second year in a row Purdue Dance Marathon has raised over one million dollars. We have also been very active around the Community this semester. We had 60 brothers clean up the Lafayette Morton community center. Then on November 15<sup>th</sup> we had 65 brothers participate in Winterization, a community service event that serves disabled residents in the Greater Lafayette area to help them prepare for winter by doing chores around their house.
