Looking forward into the Fall, the chapter

plans to have numerous events including Barn Dance (our annual country-themed event held at a local barn), Black Diamond Formal, and the first ever Phi Gam Jam - a music festival philanthropy event.

The chapter remains in good standing with Purdue and the Interfraternity Council while being an example of excellence for other fraternities. In Spring 2022, the Chapter finished 9th in GPA among the 42 Fraternities in the Purdue Interfraternity Council and 3rd among IFC chapters with over 100 members. This is the best ranking the chapter has had in over 14 semesters, and look forward to climbing the rankings further in the Fall.

Chris Burke Distinguished Fiji Award Presentation

On September 24th, 2022, Dr. Christopher B. Burke was presented with the William A. Martin III Distinguished Fiji Award (DFA) at the Lambda Iota Chapter House. The Archons of Phi Gamma Delta recognized Brother Burke with this award due to his outstanding contributions to the engineering industry, his community, and Phi Gamma Delta. The day was full of activities including a House Corporation meeting at 1:00pm, the DFA presentation at 3:30pm, and the Homecoming Football game against Florida Atlantic at 7:30pm.

• Updates from the 174th Ekklesia

In August, 584 Phi Gamma Delta brothers and guests traveled to Washington, DC for the 174th Ekklesia. The Lambda Iota chapter had three voting delegates and Purple Legionnaire, Bill Miller, in attendance. The Lambda Iota delegates were well involved in committees and deliberations over the four day convention which was capped off with social events including a Washington Nationals game and the Closing Banquet.

Leading up to the 174th Ekklesia there was a lot of evidence that changes needed to be made in the pledge ship program from a national perspective. In the proceeding four years 15 chapters had been closed and our national insurance carrier had paid \$10.2 million in claims while collecting only \$4.5 million in premiums. Thus our insurance company demanded major changes be made to the new member education process to reduce risk. Fortunately Lambda Iota had already started down a path to reduce risk years ago. We will have to make further changes but not to the extent of some chapters.

To solve the problem that the

Fraternity was faced with, delegates at Ekklesia, after much debate, adopted amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws of the Fraternity which (effective immediately) set the maximum duration of the pledge period to four (4) weeks and completely eliminate pledgeship (initiation within 4 days of acceptance of an invitation), effective July 1, 2024. This membership structure was inspired by changes made by numerous other National Fraternities who have been in similar situations over the past two decades and have had great success.


These radical changes were met with great skepticism by many undergraduate delegates, with the biggest issue being how chapters would be able to vet new members without a pledgeship period. Two solutions were determined to address this: 1) having a more rigorous rush process which stresses considering recommendations and rushing during the summer and 2) giving chapter officers the power upon a four-fifths vote to suspend or expel members. With these two solutions, the chapter should be able to find better candidates before inviting them to become a full-fledged member, and now have a more efficient way to disassociate members if necessary.

Since 1902, the Lambda Iota Chapter has evolved greatly while always keeping the same end goal in mind: to produce courageous leaders. Over the next few years, Brothers of the Lambda Iota chapter will be faced with a great challenge of evolving the chapter's great traditions with the time to continue to mold individuals into the best form of themselves.

♦ Brother Spotlight

The Fall 2022 issue of the Russell Street Review will be spotlighting Brother Matthew Kennelly Bigelow (2023) of Fishers, Indiana. Growing up, Brother Bigelow played lacrosse and golf and was involved in local CYO basketball for his grade school. In high school he was very involved and accoladed as a student. Matt was salutatorian of the class of 2019 at Cathedral High School, student council Vice President, and Spanish club President. Excellence is the best word to describe Matt Kennelly Bigelow; his ability and willingness to help others is unmatched.

Matt's journey to Purdue University was not always certain. Growing up he was always a big IU fan. His sister Maggie chose to attend Purdue his junior year of high school and that started to make Matt consider the possibility of becoming а Boilermaker. Over the last 12 years Matt and the Bigelow Family have raised over \$1 million for pancreatic cancer research. Matt's willingness to raise money and host such a large event every year to benefit other people's suffering from pancreatic cancer is the stamp on how excellent Brother Bigelow is.

On campus, Matt is a member of the Gimlet Leadership Honorary, a Greek club centered around student involvement and leadership in Purdue athletics. Being a part of the Gimlet Leadership Honorary is a privilege, recognizing a student's exceptional leadership skills and abilities. When asked about the Gimlet Leadership Honorary, Matt never mentioned that it is to recognize members for their leadership skills. This is who Brother Bigelow is, he is a humble leader. His caring generosity to those around him as well as his unassuming leadership skills are the perfect depictions of Matt's character and excellence.

As a Brother at the fraternity Phi Gamma Delta, Matt has held several positions in the house including Co-Chairman of the Chapter's Philanthropy Committee. In the Spring of 2022, he led raising over \$4,000.Matt is someone who never thinks of himself first. Over the years, Brother Bigelow has given back to multiple charities, raised money for cancer research in his home community and is a leader on campus as well as in the Chapter.

The Fall semester was kicked off with a successful rush led by recruitment chairs Zander Klekovkin (2023), Michael Uhrig (2024), and Makai Mitchell (2025). These brothers organized rush events including a summer grill out in the Indianapolis area, basketball in the parking lot, house tours, room talks, and a cookout. The New Member Class of 2026 consists of 27 total members (25 freshmen and 2 sophomores) from a variety of hometowns and majors, including 8 legacies and many rushees recommended by brothers. PC26 will be the first pledge class to experience the changes made by the 174th Ekklesia, and will be experiencing an evolved New Member Education process, which the cabinet and new member educators believe will still produce the courageous leaders that have been a product of Purdue Fiji since 1902.
