
The Undergraduate brothers of the Lambda Iota Chapter are happy to bring to you, once again, another edition of *The Russell Street Review*.

♦ From the Cabinet

The Spring 2023 semester wrapped up well for the Lambda Iota chapter. The chapter remained a leader in all aspects on campus, performing high in scholarship, philanthropy, and community service while maintaining a great social reputation.

The chapter is in good standing with Purdue and during the spring semester had 114 active brothers with 49 living in and 5 are studying abroad or participating in a co-op internship. Life at 640 continues to operate normally with no more COVID restrictions at Purdue. The chapter achieved a grade point average of 3.14 which will again likely land in the top 3 semester GPAs for houses larger than 100 members (FSCL grade reports are not released until late June). In addition, the house averaged at least 3 hours per brother of community service.

In March, the Chapter hosted Pig Dinner in the Buchanan room at Ross-Ade Stadium (more on page 3). ♦ Graduate Relations


